Founded AESOP Institute 1973. Evaluated hundreds of energy generating inventions. A very small number are extraordinarily promising. Included in that latter group is conversion of engines to run on water - as well as piston engines and turbines designed to run on ambient atmospheric heat. The stored heat of the atmosphere can substitute for fuel. This huge reservoir of stored solar energy, much larger than Earth's fossil fuel reserves, can be tapped for uninterrupted power. Sustaining these difficult to believe missing keys to rapid replacement of fossil fuels has been a financial nightmare.

SunWind Ltd. became the first commercial affiliate of AESOP Institute in 1985. it was superseded by Magnetic Power Inc. which became Chava Energy. It had earlier launched Room Temperature Superconductors Inc., a subsidiary. Raised \$10m & in addition completed 4 DOD SBIR Contracts for the revolutionary, pioneering work, which opened doors to potentially very inexpensive, cost-competitive, green energy breakthroughs under development by AESOP Energy.

Addressed four annual Global Superconductivity Conferences, two National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) Enterprise Forums and the 2004 Arlington Institute Conference on Breakthrough Technologies for the World's Biggest Problems. Nominated for the 2006 World Technology Award in Energy.
